

WEDNESDAY PANDEMIC UPDATE:

June 2, 2021: Day 448 COVID-19 Pandemic Update

SECOND & THIRD WAVE CASES

- To date, there have been a total of 2,169 COVID-19 cases confirmed within First Nations communities since the beginning of the pandemic.
 - There have been 2,103 cases in the second and third wave so far (September 12, 2020 – present).
 - o There were 66 cases in the first wave (March 11, 2020 September 11, 2020).
- 65 new cases were reported in communities this week (May 26th to June 1st).
 - This is an 86% increase from last week's total.



Please note: To keep information as up to date as possible, our reporting dates currently reflect a Wednesday-Tuesday reporting schedule.

VARIANTS OF CONCERN (VOCs) IN FIRST NATION COMMUNITIES

- The third wave of the pandemic is being driven by the rapidly spreading and more contagious mutations, known as Variants of Concern (VOCs).
 - o 96 mutations (VOCs) have been confirmed in 9 First Nation communities to date.
- As the VOCs are highly transmissible, public health measures must be strictly followed in order to prevent any outbreaks in First Nation communities.

- The South West region has experienced the most cases of COVID-19.
- The current total resolve rate is 94%.


- Currently, there are **91 active** COVID-19 cases within First Nations communities.
 - o This is a 94% increase from last week's total.

This information also comes from a different source than the COO Health Sector and should not be confused with the information the Health Sector provides.
